

Destination Activity Report Summary 2024

Fareham Academy Career Guidance



Year 12 Establishments and Leavers

The table below shows the most popular establishments attended by Year 11 leavers from Fareham Academy who moved on to full-time education programmes as of 1st November 2024. It includes the number of students attending the establishment and the percentage they represent compared to all Fareham Academy full-time education leavers.

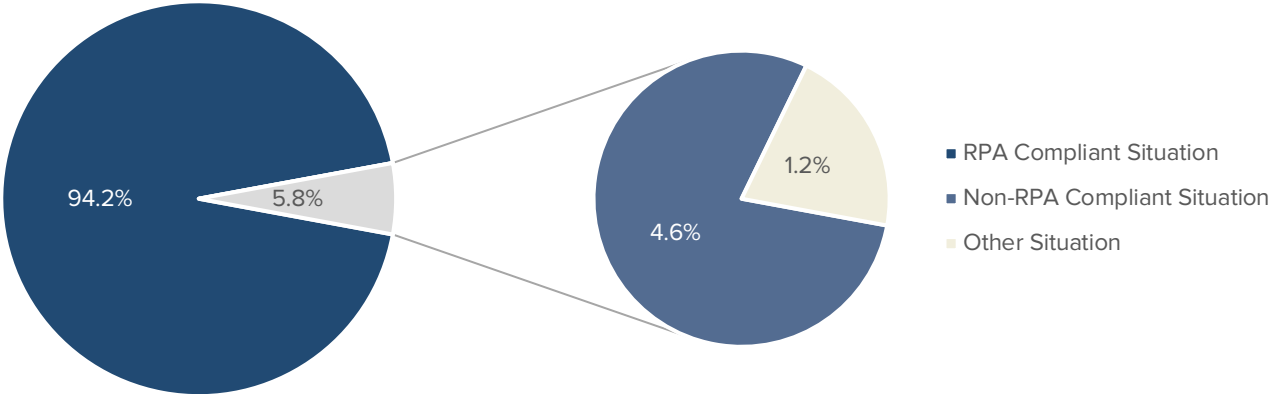
Education Programme Types and Leavers

The table below shows the actual numbers of young people in each programme type. Where fewer than five people are recorded, the information is withheld and replaced with “-”. Full-time Level 3 Vocational/Technical courses were the most popular Level 3 progression route, with 55 leavers choosing this option, followed by 32 leavers progressing to A-Level courses. In total, over half of our leavers (87 students) advanced to Level 3 courses, possibly influenced by the extensive Provider Access activities aligned with the Government’s skills strategies.

Participation in Education or Training

The chart below shows that 94.2% of Fareham Academy Year 11 students in 2024 moved to participating situations that meet the DfE-defined 'Raising the Participation Age (RPA)', meaning these leavers are continuing in education or training until the age of 18.



Of the remaining 5.8%, the 'Other' category includes young people who are on a temporary break, unable to engage due to personal reasons, whose situation is unknown, or who have moved out of the area.

Comparison with Hampshire

The chart below shows the total Hampshire cohort and indicates that 92.8% of Hampshire Year 11 leavers moved to positive post-16 situations in 2024. The percentage for Fareham Academy is higher than that for Hampshire, indicating that Fareham Academy leavers are less likely to become NEET (not in education, employment or training). Fareham Academy learners are more likely to have positive destinations post-16.
