# Starting at Fareham Academy September 2023


Unlocking Potential | Creating Opportunity

Fareham Academy will look different to your primary school. It might be bigger.

# To make finding your way around easier, the school is set out in blocks (A-E).



# You will have to wear Fareham Academy's school uniform.



School jumpers do not have to be worn at all times, however blazers must be worn every day.

#### Hair & Makeup

Styles should not be extreme in fashion. No outrageous or unusual colours are permitted. Shaved heads are not acceptable. Students can be sent home if they come to school with a haircut close to their scalp. Year 11 students are permitted to wear discreet make up and clear or natural coloured nail varnish. Students in all other years are not permitted to wear make-up or nail varnish and will be asked to remove it.

#### Jewellery

Students may only wear:

- A watch
- A single chain with religious symbol hidden from view
- Single studs in the ear

Please note that no other jewellery will be allowed.

The school day might be different to your primary school.

We start school at 8:30am and finish at 2:40pm.

# A bell will ring to tell you;

- when school starts
- when lessons finish
- when lunch and break times are
- when to go home.



The bell will also ring continuously when there is a fire drill.

When this happens, your teacher will lead you to the nearest exit and you will make your way to the tennis courts.

Your tutor will practise fire drills with you and show you where you need to stand.



At Fareham Academy, you get a break which lasts 15 minutes and a lunch break that lasts 30 minutes.

At breaks and lunches you can spend it; in the canteen, in the Main Hall, or outside.

There will always be teachers on duty if you have any worries or need to ask a question.



The canteen is supervised and serves a range of hot and cold food and drinks. You will need to pay for these at the tills using your fingerprint which takes the money from your biometrics account. Money can be added to your biometrics account by your parents, or by putting money into the biometrics machine in E Block.

During lunch and break, your teacher would prefer you to use the toilet, but of course if it is absolutely necessary your teacher will allow you to use it during the lesson.



At Fareham Academy, you will be given a personal timetable.

You will need to know your timetable as it tells you; what lessons you have, what teachers you have, where the lessons will be and what time they start. It also shows you when break and lunch are.

Here is an example of a timetable:



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To help you be organised at school, we will give you a contact book.

You can use it to; stick your timetable in, write down important dates, write down your ingredients for food technology or write any homework into it.

Your first contact book is issued for free, but if you lose it you can buy a new one from Reception for £3.



To help you be organised at school, there is also an option of a locker.

To get a locker, you need to go and see a member of Student Support Services. You will pay £15 and the locker will be yours until Year 11 when you leave.

Your locker key will need to be returned at the end of Year 11. If you lose your key, a replacement key will be cut at a charge of £10, so keep it safe!



To help you be organised at school, ensure you have the following equipment; pen, pencil, ruler, highlighter, eraser, contact book and PE kit when needed. You may also need to bring in food ingredients for Food Technology.

It is really useful if you check your bag the night before to make sure you have all of your equipment.



Sometimes you might feel poorly in school. Your teacher will then allow you to go to Student Support Services and they will decide what support you need.

Medical passes and toilet passes can be issued by Student Support Services to students that need them. Student services can also hold medication for students with signed permission from parents.

### What is a rumour and what does it mean?

A rumour is a currently circulating story of uncertain or doubtful truth. This means that people may be talking about things that are not true to try to worry or frighten you.
