

Careers and Provider Access Policy

This policy statement sets out Fareham Academy's arrangements for managing the access of providers to pupils at the school for the purpose of giving them information about education and training offers Post 16 and Post 18. This complies with the school's legal obligation under:

- Section 42A (1), 42B and 45A of the Education Act 1997.
- Section 72 of the Education and Skills Act 2008.

- to understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.
